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Describe a moment in your worshipping community's recent ministry which you recognize as one of success and fulfillment.

Our church buildings and grounds are a visible sign of our ministry and are a focal point for the parish and the community. After St. Anne's sold a parcel of land for a senior residence for the deaf, the proceeds allowed St. Anne's to remodel the church into a more flexible worship space, and turned the garden into a sacred space. In 2005, the full-sized outdoor Labyrinth was constructed. In 2015, the Columbarium and Memorial Fountain were completed, and blessed by our Bishop. Several beloved parishioners are laid to rest there. We gather there regularly as a parish for worship and events. Our beautiful grounds are open to the public for meditation, labyrinth walking, prayer, and photography.

How are your preparing yourselves for the Church of the future?

We have recognized the importance of and enthusiastically embraced the work our Interim Rector has done to expand our use of technology using social media. Updating our website has greatly increased our visibility and starting an email newsletter has improved our parish communication. This is particularly important in our multicultural area and for reaching people of multiple generations. We recognize that the world is changing and we look forward to meeting the challenges ahead.

As a worshipping community, how do you care for your spiritual, emotional and physical well-being?

In addition to the ministries listed on the Our Ministries page, our clergy and parish members have their fingers on the pulse of the congregation, and together we support those in need. Based on our size, the care often happens in an organic way. The Rector also responds to specific pastoral requests and offers referrals and support to those in need. We have an active prayer list for special thanksgivings and those in need.



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How do you engage in pastoral care for those beyond your worshipping community?

Our wider community is highly multi-cultural. Our Rector has been an active leader in the Tri Valley Interfaith Council, and our parishioners attend interfaith events, such as the recent Peace gatherings in response to recent events, and the annual ecumenical Thanksgiving service, rotated among various places of worship. We are committed to local community outreach. We work with Abode Services, a homeless shelter near St. Anne's, providing meals on a regular basis, collecting and donating socks and backpacks. We also support Sacred Space, a homeless ministry of our Diocese. We prepare lunches, gather supplies, and participate in their worship service. Describe your worshipping community's involvement in either the wider Church or geographical region.

St. Anne's is active in our Deanery and Diocese. We attend Deanery meetings and events, including the annual Deanery-wide Vestry weekend at Bishops Ranch, and members have served on the Deanery and Executive Councils. Our previous Rector was involved in the Diocesan Stewardship Commission, and we regularly send children to Diocesan camps. We value our connections across the Diocese.

Tell about a ministry that your worshipping community has initiated in the past five years. Who can be contacted about this?

Volunteers at St. Anne's started a prayer shawl ministry for distribution to those in need of comfort and spiritual support. As an extension to this program, members are now providing knitted hats for premature babies that are distributed at a local hospital's Neonatal Unit. 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What is your practice of stewardship and how does it shape the life of your worshipping community?

Since 2008 we have approached stewardship as a year-long ministry of gratitude and generosity, of reflection and discovery, connecting it to our faith formation programs and retreats. For example, we explored the book, The Soul of Money, one year, and celebrated an outdoor service on Earth Day as a way to focus on being good stewards of the Earth. We assembled a book of stewardship reflections by the member of St. Anne's. We continue to be grateful for our abundant gifts. For many years, St Anne's has run a deficit, using our savings to meet our operating expenses. During our Interim time, we have realized the potential of sharing our space as a way to be good stewards of our facility, while additionally raising income. Recently, we began renting our space to an Indian congregation that worships in their native language of Telegu. More information can be found on our website.

What is your worshipping community's experience of conflict? And how have you addressed it?

Twenty years ago there was a conflict in church leadership that resulted in a substantial reduction in membership. Since then we have had few conflicts of note that weren't resolved with open communication and open hearts. We do have differences of opinion. Generally everyone wants to support a healthy St Anne's community, but with different ways to achieve that. We are tolerant of diversity, including different points of view. Our many years of deep spiritual experiences like EfM, women's retreats, Christian education, and reflection groups have built a strong foundation of respectful relationships.

What is your experience leading/addressing change in the church? When has it gone well? When has it gone poorly? And what did you learn?

We are a small church and we are fairly flexible. We appreciate collaborative leadership, and have embraced fresh perspectives and ideas from our clergy. We like to explore different liturgies, artistic expression, and musical styles, and inhabit a flexible worship space. We have learned that our congregation does not respond well to autocratic clergy, and that open dialog is important.
